Dear Parents,

As part of our efforts to protect your child and comply with bill 3 2005 “the Act to Protect Anaphylactic Pupils” or “Sabrina Law”, we respectfully request parents of Anaphylactic Children to assist us with the following procedures:

- Complete the attached form, signed by your child’s physician, and return it to Glenn Arbour Academy
- Supply the school with three (3) EpiPens or 2 ‘Twin Jet’. One for your child to have on them, one for their camp instructor and one for the Front Office
- Inform Glenn Arbour Academy immediately of any changes to your child’s health history

If your child has been prescribed an EpiPen, our protocol is:

- To share your child’s information with all staff members, including posting your child’s personal Anaphylaxis emergency Plan in the Front Office and your child’s home room
- We will administer the EpiPen immediately upon the first sign of reaction occurring in conjunction with their known allergen or suspected contact with the allergen.
- Call 911 and administer a second does 10-15 minutes or sooner if the reaction continues or worsens
- Call the contact person
- A staff member will accompany your child in the ambulance and wait at the hospital until the contact person arrives

All staff members have been trained on how to administrator an EpiPen.

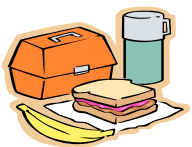

Campers Backpack

Items to be sent to camp with your child each day:

1. Healthy Lunch and Snacks

- Lunch should be brought each day with your child
 - Nutritional snacks should also be packed such as cheese and crackers or fruits and vegetables
 - Labelled water bottle and/or extra juice boxes



****Please note we are a NUT FREE environment, if your child brings products that contain nuts he/she will not be allowed to eat them****

2. Clothing

- Your child should be dressed weather appropriate with an extra set of clothing in their backpack (ie. Socks, underwear, shorts, shirt, hat, gloves and a jacket)
- Comfortable, well fitting shoes are a must as children will be involved in active sports play
- A pair of skates and a helmet are encouraged if weather permits.

Code of Behaviour

Campers are expected to follow behavioural expectations and the established summer camp routines. These expectations and routines are designed to ensure the safety and security of all children.

Student behaviours that are harmful to others and/or destructive to personal or school property will not be tolerated. Such behaviours will result in dismissal from the programme without refund.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up Routines

Drop-Off Procedures:

Early morning programme: For children registered in the Before Camp Program, parents are asked to personally bring their child/children into the Before Camp Program room where before camp supervisors will be present to sign-in campers and involve them in activities.

9:00 am drop off: Children should be instructed to go to their designated camp program room. Younger children are asked be assisted by a parent or older siblings. Camp counsellors will sign each child in.

If your child is going to be absent please call the school ahead of time to inform us. We ask that children arrive no later than 9:15 am so camp programs can start on time.

Pick-Up Procedures:

Children will be dismissed at 3:00 pm in the fenced in area at the side of the school. Children will be supervised and parents are asked to personally come into the fenced in area to pick-up their child as children are not permitted to walk through the parking lot unattended.

If your child is in the after school program they will be brought to the after school program room where they will receive a snack and participate in activities until you arrive. Doors will be locked after 3:15 pm, to retrieve your child from the after camp program you are asked to ring the door bell at the front door. Please note that you will be required to sign your child out.

If your child is not picked up by 6:00 pm an additional fees will apply as follows: pick after 6:10 is an automatic \$5.00 charge to the supervising teacher with an additional dollar for every minute after this time that you are late. We appreciate your compliance with our camp program schedule.
